

26TH ANNUAL BEER FEST


May 3



“Eat like a Local” takes a look at
some of our favorite pizza joints!

PIZZA CAN BE A POWERFUL THING. REMEMBER GRADE SCHOOL, WHEN THE PROMISE OF A PIZZA PARTY WAS THE MOST EXCITING NEWS IMAGINABLE? OR ALL OF THOSE CLUB MEETINGS IN COLLEGE THAT GOT US IN THE DOOR SIMPLY BY OFFERING A FREE SLICE OR TWO? IT'S REPORTED THAT 350 PIECES OF PIZZA ARE EATEN EVERY SECOND IN THE UNITED STATES, AND THE RENO AREA HAS NO SHORTAGE OF FANTASTIC PIE PURVEYORS THAT DO THEIR PART TO CONTRIBUTE TO THAT STATISTIC. CHANNEL YOUR INNER PIZZA HUNTER AND CHECK OUT SOME OF THE BEST 'ZA THE AREA HAS TO OFFER AT NOBLE PIE PARLOR, SMILING WITH HOPE PIZZA, JJ'S PIE CO., AND ECLIPSE PIZZA COMPANY.

NOBLE PIE PARLOR

In Midtown, if you pulled aside the nearest person and asked what his or her favorite pizza place is, you'd likely get the same answer from most of them: Noble Pie (or if you find someone who's been around for a while, they might say "Pie-Face Pizza," Noble's former moniker). Owners Trevor Leppek and Ryan Goldhammer have established a much-loved spot where locals and tourists can enjoy a slice and a drink in a warm atmosphere.

What some locals might not know is that the name "Noble Pie" actually came about because of a completely different concept: a speakeasy. Goldhammer explained that the ownership group toyed with the idea of opening a hidden bar called "The Noble" after "The Noble Experiment," a reference to prohibition. When the owners were abruptly forced to find a new name for their pizza place, the concept was repurposed, and they used the name Noble Pie for their popular pizzeria instead. The quality of the pizza at Noble Pie is far from a secret; they roll out incredible East Coast-inspired pies with little touches of the West Coast.

The restaurant uses an 8th generation Sicilian dough recipe and 4th generation Brooklyn sauce recipe in their pizzas, calzones, and strombolis; the authenticity is something that can be tasted in each bite. They also hand-make all their sausages and meatballs, along with most items on the menu (even the ranch dressing is housemade). Round out the meal with some garlic knots, polenta, or their "Burg-Style" wings, and it's a guarantee you won't be leaving hungry.



Noble Pie Midtown is located at 777 S. Center Street #100 in Reno, and is open Monday and Tuesday from 11 a.m. to midnight, Wednesday from 11 a.m. to 1 a.m., Thursday from 11 a.m. to 2 a.m., Friday from 11 a.m. to 3 a.m., Saturday from 10 a.m. to 3 a.m., and Sunday from 10 a.m. to 10 p.m.

Noble Pie Downtown is located at 239 W. 2nd Street in Reno, and is open Monday and Tuesday from noon to midnight, Wednesday from noon to 1 a.m., Thursday from noon to 3 a.m., Friday from noon to 4 a.m., Saturday from 10 a.m. to 4 a.m., and Sunday from 10 a.m. to 9 p.m.



SMILING WITH HOPE

Growing up in a home full of top-notch Italian cooks, Walter Glosinski started his culinary training in the 1950s with beloved family members. He developed a passion for New York-style pizza – a passion that continues 60 years later. While making delicious food was a big priority for Glosinski, he also wanted his kitchens to do something more. With this in mind, he started working with people with developmental disabilities, and weaved his passions together by creating Smiling With Hope Pizza.

Leading up to the opening of Smiling With Hope, Glosinski worked for 22 years opening different restaurants and bakeries across the country in public schools. These kitchens helped train students with disabilities for competitive jobs. Glosinski has also worked with a who's who of pizza chefs and culinary schools all over the world to help him hone his recipes and provide the best pies possible. Smiling With Hope is modeled after the small cafés and pizza places that Glosinski grew up patronizing. He pulls even more tradition into the pizza-making process itself, using 1960s' gas deck ovens, which, according to the Smiling With Hope website, are the "Holy Grail for NY pizza." Every pizza has a hand-stretched crust and is baked directly on a pizza stone to assure that the crust gets nice and crispy.

With four different styles of pizza (Classic New York, New York Ricotta, Sicilian, and Ricotta Sicilian) and a selection of toppings, Smiling With Hope can throw together a pizza to fit almost any craving you have. The menu also features calzones, garlic knots, salads, and a few desserts to indulge your sweet tooth. Make sure to try the Cannoli Sandwich, a unique invention of cannoli filling between two chocolate chip cookies. It's the perfect end to a great meal.

Smiling With Hope Pizza is located at 6135 Lakeside Drive #101 in Reno, and is open Tuesday through Friday from noon to 2 p.m. and from 5 p.m. to 8 p.m., and Saturday from 5 p.m. to 8 p.m.





JJ'S PIE CO.

Sometimes, we want to hang somewhere that feels like we've been going there forever. Something akin to the old TV show *Cheers*, where the beer is cold, the pizza is hot and tasty, and the staff treats you like a regular from the second you step in the door. If you're willing to go just a tiny bit off the beaten path in downtown Reno, you'll find just this type of place on 5th Street at JJ's Pie Co.

JJ's opened its doors in 1983, and has been family owned and operated ever since. The restaurant's goal is simple: serve the best quality pizza possible, and they're not afraid to put in the extra work to make sure they accomplish that goal. Boasting a relaxed, casual atmosphere, JJ's is a great place to watch the game and knock back some pitchers with friends. Their pizzas are packed full of fresh ingredients and awesome flavors, and the menu has enough variety to satisfy the pickiest eater. Aside from the pizzas, a selection of appetizers, hot and cold sub sandwiches, and salads is available.

If you're looking for something a little different, check out some of JJ's specialty pizzas. For those who enjoy the spicier side of life, the Valdez features chorizo, jalapeños, sausage, tomatoes, bell peppers, and cumin – a great pizza for cold weather. If you're feeling a little more West Coast, the Baja has chicken, pepperoncini, garlic, sun-dried tomatoes, artichoke hearts, and chorizo. Head on over because the crew at JJ's is ready to make you feel right at home.

JJ's Pie Co. is located at 555 W. 5th Street in Reno, and is open Sunday through Thursday from 11 a.m. to 10 p.m. and Friday and Saturday from 11 a.m. to 11 p.m.

ECLIPSE PIZZA COMPANY

Reno-ite Dave Fish is a very active man. He coaches swimming and participates in some of the most high-level endurance races in the country. Ironman events, running, cycling, hiking, skiing – he does it all. It might sound counterproductive, but sometimes when you're done with a workout or a soul-crushing endurance race, all you want is a good piece of pizza. You can get just that – and more – at Fish's pizzeria, Eclipse Pizza Company.

If you're driving too fast down McCarran, you may miss this little pizza joint, tucked into the Mayberry Landing Shopping Center on the west end of town. For many, it's a hidden gem that has a menu full of old standbys and a few surprising twists. Being a restaurant run by an athlete, it likely surprises no one that

there are some healthier options on the menu such as gluten-free crusts and fan-favorite cauliflower pizza crusts. The salads are also quite popular, particularly the Apple Goat Cheese Salad featuring candied pecans, dried cranberries, grape tomatoes, apple slices, and goat cheese tossed in a champagne vinaigrette. There's even a secret menu that not only has some "outside-the-box" pizzas, (a Paleo Pizza with crispy fried pepperonis as the crust is an option), but also some downright dangerous-sounding ways to cut your pizza. The description for the Ninja style reads: "... casualties to worker and pizza are possible." Scary.

Whether you've just finished a 5K or you're craving a slice on a night off, look for the bright yellow and orange sun and moon on Reno's west side. If you ask nicely enough, the chefs might even make a pizza in a specialty shape. Eclipse's Facebook feed is full of wreaths, hearts, bunny rabbits – whatever the occasion calls for. No matter the shape, chances are you'll fall in love with the pizza from the first bite. ■

Winter COCKTAILS



Chapel Tavern

Find salvation this winter at Chapel Tavern. Located in Midtown, the industrial-style bar creates a unique experience where drink is their religion.

Opened in 2007 by T. Duncan Mitchell, a native Nevadan, the bar exemplifies tradition and innovation. The full bar's selections are ever-evolving and continually expanding to include rarities and specialty items, perfectly picked for every drink. No matter what your guilty pleasure is, or if you're looking to try something new, Chapel's friendly, talented bartenders are ready to assist you in your boozy journey.

When it's cold outside, pick from a variety of classic hot drinks like Hot Buttered Rum and Mulled Cider or treat your taste buds to Café Bravado, a cognac drink with fernet, chartreuse, cinnamon, Magpie Coffee Roasters' coffee, cream, and nutmeg. If tequila is your calling, try El Chapo, a mixture of añejo tequila, coffee, dark brown sugar, and spicy chilies.

Chapel Tavern is located at 1099 South Virginia Street in Reno, and is open Monday through Friday 2 p.m. to close, and Saturday and Sunday 10 a.m. to close.

Other seasonal selections range from the Barrel Aged Boulevardier, a warm bourbon whiskey served over hand-cut ice, to The Pilgrim, a navy-strength rum served with orange, sweet potato, and marshmallow. A local favorite holiday drink – and Mitchell's go-to – is the house-made Aged Nog. The drink is a blend of local eggs and cream plus spices, bourbon, and cognac, then celled until ready to serve. There's a reason why it's the bar's biggest seller year after year.

Indecisive? Just ask the team to make you a drink. Feeling a tequila night? Or maybe it's a try-something-new kind of day? Without hesitation, the bartenders will almost undoubtedly get on the ladder to peruse the floor-to-ceiling selection to find the perfect drink for you.

Death & Taxes

Fresh, seasonal ingredients rule every cocktail at this classy lounge.

Established in 2013 by team Ivan Fontana and Sadie Bonnette, Death & Taxes has become a mecca of infusion, often making classic drinks with a unique twist. Each artisanal cocktail has elaborate ingredients and house-made syrups, garnished to perfection.

Death & Taxes is located at 26 Cheney Street in Reno, and is open Sunday from 5 p.m. to 11 p.m., Monday through Thursday from 2 p.m. to midnight, and Friday and Saturday from 2 p.m. to 1 a.m.

Dark and stormy winter weather often calls for a dark and delicious drink. Venture into the bourbon world and try The Black Gates, a deep drink with Gunpowder Bourbon, scotch, Drambuie, lemon, and green cardamom syrup. If you need a reminder of the warm summer days, sip on a Dead & Lovely – a mixture of toasted coconut bourbon, dark rum, vanilla, pineapple, lemon, and mango syrup.

Whatever you drink, you'll find it here. Go for a classic Gin & Tonic – with plenty of variations on the menu – or try Death & Taxes Old Fashioned with toasted coconut Henry McKenna 10 Year, five-spice demerara syrup, and the bar's own tobacco bitters.

Beyond the cocktail menu and Spirits Bible, Death & Taxes offers classes tailor-made for your group. Test out your bartending skills, learn all you can about tequila and mescal or bourbon, how to batch cocktails, and more. Take your newly learned knowledge to the test and bring home some hand-selected bottles from the Death & Taxes Bottle Shop to make your own.



Ferrace Lounge

All we want for Christmas is a glass of deliciousness, found tucked inside the Peppermill Reno. Step out of the cold and into the Terrace Lounge.

Craft cocktails, views of the Peppermill gardens and pools, and nightly live music make this spot the place to be. Grab a seat on one of the plush couches and sip the night away with award-winning wines, exclusive whiskeys, or one of these seasonal drinks made with locally sourced ingredients.

Sweet notes and tart, fresh blends create perfect cocktails to warm you from the inside out. Test out a twist on a Manhattan with the Winter Wonderland, or if you prefer drinks on the rocks, taste a CranBaby where a citrus-forward Brooklyn Gin gets a tart kick from cranberry syrup and a touch of mint. Go ahead and entice your taste buds with a gingerbread Old Fashioned named All I Want for Christmas – the warm flavors of a traditional gingerbread cookie meets spicy Clyde May's Rye Whiskey, garnished with a fresh gingerbread man from the Peppermill bakery.



Feeling a little lucky? During the Lunar New Year, oranges and mandarins are given for good luck, with the color red symbolizing good fortune and joy. At the Terrace Lounge, order a Lucky Star made with Casamigos Blanco, a fresh citrus blend of blood orange, lime, and lemon, topped with Jarritos Mandarin soda, creating a lucky paloma.

If you're looking for a sweeter adventure, order a Hula Brew – a Hawaiian getaway in a glass – made with Kona Cold Brew Coffee, coconut cream, and Buffalo Trace Bourbon Blend. Take a sip of a Let It Snow – a reimagined piece of peppermint bark. House-made peppermint cream, Godiva White Chocolate Liqueur, and Absolut Elyx Vodka combine in a dark Chirardelli Chocolate swirled glass to create a sweet sip.

If it all sounds too good, let the professionals decide. All you have to do is pick the spirit and flavors you enjoy, and the mixologists will handle the rest. ■

A Platform for *Fun*

It's not about the destination, it's about the experience. Unlike busy airports and crowded highways, the Reno Fun Train, operated by Amtrak, focuses on making travel enjoyable for all of its 500 passengers. A Club Dance Car, Piano Lounge, and Elvis tribute artist are just some of the amenities you will find on this lively locomotive. The Reno Fun Train allows its passengers to enjoy a unique vacation experience from the very first minute they step aboard to the moment they reach their destination.

Proudly running for 52 years, the Reno Fun Train began as a means of bringing in business to Reno and providing employment for the Southern Pacific crews during wintertime. Through the collaboration of the Reno Chamber of Commerce and Southern Pacific Railroads, the Reno Fun Train started its engines in 1963 for the first time.

This 15-car train will run from Northern California cities – Emeryville, Richmond (BART connection), Martinez, Suisun, and Sacramento – to Reno exclusively during February and March in 2020. The cold winter seasons in the Sierra Nevada region have a tendency to keep crowds inside under warm blankets, but on the Fun Train, one can enjoy the brisk, beautiful landscape without having to endure the frigid weather outside. While you're enjoying a cocktail and a snack, soak in the views of the snow white Sierra Nevada mountains all the way to the bright city lights of Reno surrounding you.





Don't leave your skin high and dry this winter. A good skincare routine, along with spa treatments when needed, will keep your skin glistening and nourished all the way to summer.

The weather may not be the only frightful outcome this winter season. Nevada is known for its dry climate, and paired with chilling winds, your skin is susceptible to dryness, itching, and irritation. The best way to avoid the discomfort and dehydration during winter is to maintain a regular skincare routine and add spa services when necessary.

What does a good skincare routine look like? It should start from the beginning of your morning and last until right before bedtime.

When winter rolls around, there is nothing better than starting your day with a hot shower. Unfortunately, hot water can dehydrate the skin, causing it to become dry and itchy. Although a lukewarm shower doesn't sound like the most pleasant experience, it's the best temperature for your skin. If a hot shower is nonnegotiable, turn the water to a cooler temperature a few minutes before exiting. This not only helps your pores temporarily tighten (keeping dirt and bacteria from entering), but also prevents the skin from being stripped of its natural oils too soon.

Moisturizing immediately after showering is essential. A good moisturizing routine starts with eye cream. The area around the eyes is most vulnerable to dehydration and fine lines. When applying, be mindful that this skin is extremely sensitive and should be handled with care. A good rule of thumb is to use your ring fingers to gently apply eye cream under your eyes and surrounding areas.

After eye cream is applied, a serum can be used to add the extra moisture your skin will need. A serum containing hyaluronic acid is perfect for skin types ranging from sensitive to oily. Hyaluronic serums keep the skin hydrated and supple, increase skin elasticity, smooth fine lines and wrinkles, and plump the skin tissue for younger-looking skin.

If you've chosen to add a serum to your routine, the next step will be your daily moisturizer. A good moisturizer will last up to eight hours and contains a sun protection factor (SPF) of 15 or higher. Moisturizer options are bountiful and should be chosen based on skin type (sensitive, dry, or oily). For the colder months, it is recommended to use a heavier moisturizer to compensate for the skin's susceptibility to dryness.

Although you may not see the sun on a snow day, it is still important to apply SPF at the beginning of the day and throughout the day if you will be outside. Once in the morning should be sufficient if you'll be indoors, but if you plan to ski or snowboard the day away, reapplying sunscreen every half hour to two hours depending on the amount of SPF contained in your sunscreen is imperative to protect your skin. Also, keep SPF in mind when choosing a lip salve. The shininess of lip balms and glosses will attract the sun, causing the lips to burn and crack. Even though your daily moisturizer should contain SPF, it is always best practice to apply additional sunscreen at the end of your skincare routine.

The face is not the only part of the body that needs TLC during colder weather. It is important to moisturize your entire body from head to toe, especially your hands, knees, and elbows. These areas dry out quickly, causing the skin to crack. Make this a part of your morning skincare routine, and reapply lotion when you see fit. If you're on the go and need a conveniently sized lotion, Spa Toscana carries Pure Fiji hand cream that will make your skin feel, look, and smell amazing.

Products with alcohol, heavy fragrances, and harsh chemicals should not be used, especially during the winter. If you're prone to acne or hyperpigmentation, retinols, which stimulate the production of new skin cells, may be a staple in your skincare routine. Retinols should be used cautiously in the winter months because overuse can cause dehydrated skin to peel. Carefully read labels on skincare products before purchasing to avoid potential irritants and buyer's remorse.




1. RENO RODEO

4. RENO-TAHOE ODYSSEY

Earn your badge of honor for completing a 24-hour relay run around the Reno-Tahoe region.

Teams of typically 12 runners start a loop course in Reno and travel through Truckee, Tahoe City, South Lake Tahoe, Genoa, Carson City, Virginia City, and back to Reno. Each team caravans in two (highly decorated) vans throughout the course, encouraging teammates throughout the way, while each runner takes on three legs ranging between three and eight miles each.

While running the RTO may sound like a daunting task, there are two other relay races nestled within the grand race so it can be an experience for every level of runner. The Capital Odyssey Relay is from Carson City, Nevada's capital, to Reno, and joins within the last 12 legs – about 54 miles – of the RTO course. The Comstock Odyssey Relay is from Virginia City to Reno, and joins within the last six legs – or about 30 miles of the course.

If running the RTO with other runners doesn't sound like a challenge enough, there are "ultra" teams consisting of six or fewer runners or an option to complete the race on your own. Only seven people have been inducted into RTO's Circle of Fame. Will you be next? ■




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Where Snowshoeing Meets Snowbirds


You won't find a dedicated trail guiding you to Chickadee Ridge, but the short jaunt – less than 2 miles each way – into the woods will be well worth it. Here, the mountain chickadees are abundant, filling the air with a distinct three-note call that sounds oddly like the word “cheeseburger” (which is how the nickname “cheeseburger bird” was earned). The closer you get to the top of the ridge overlooking Lake Tahoe, the more chickadees will appear. With some bird-friendly treats strategically placed, it's almost certain that the members of the winged welcoming committee will perch on your hand, arm, shoulder, or even head for a snack – and a seriously Instagram-worthy photo op. If you don't feel comfortable feeding wildlife, which is typically not encouraged, know that the chickadees here are so used to human visitors that they flit about as if they were expecting you. Get ready to make feathered friends no matter what.

This trip can be made in any season, but it's especially awe-inspiring when done in the winter. A layer of snow means snowshoes will be required, but the powdery wonderland is part of the fun – and again, think of the photos! Many places in the Reno-Tahoe region will rent you snowshoes if you are new to the activity, too. Just make sure you don't blaze your way through the wilderness unprepared. Do your own research before hiking Chickadee Ridge, as there's no shortage of tips that maximize fun and minimize risk.

To get to Chickadee Ridge, drive less than an hour outside of Reno toward Tahoe Meadows on Mt. Rose Highway (Highway 431). You'll find a parking area opposite a popular sledding hill. From the trailhead, start walking the boardwalk through the meadow, following signs toward the Tahoe Rim Trail. Enter the forest and walk on this trail for about 1.5 miles, then continue until you reach directional signage pointing out Meadow Loop and Ophir Creek trails. At this point, head southwest toward the top of the ridge line. Once Lake Tahoe becomes visible, you've arrived.



Our Insider Tips

- Friendly dogs are welcome at Chickadee Ridge, but you'll know best if your furry friend's antics might scare away the birds. You'll also want to protect their paws from the elements!
- Heavy snowfall can cover trail signage, making pre-trip research extra important.
- While Tahoe Meadows is a popular area, it's always recommended to practice back country safety. Bring plenty of water, stay aware of your surroundings, outfit yourself in the proper gear, and let someone know where you're going.
- Pack a thermos of hot chocolate to enjoy amongst the chickadees! ■
